(Extracts from a letter received from a prominent American Esperantist----name and address furnished on request.):

"You surely must have ~~had~~ given it (Esperido) much study and pains to evolve a really finished Project. If Esperanto had not preempted the field with its all too poorly constructed scheme, your Esperido would leave nothing to be further desired. You have eliminated all the glaring defects of Esperanto and propose a really perfect medium.-----You have evolved a really perfect scheme and if you had the means to propagate it over the whole world it would eventually be accepted .-----I will adopt your scheme and morally give you what assistance I can. I will have to learn a new ILO as I learned Volapuk and Esperanto. I will have to get used to your changes----eventually their need and propriety will be recognized; that is, future students will regret that your improvements had not been accepted in the first place."
